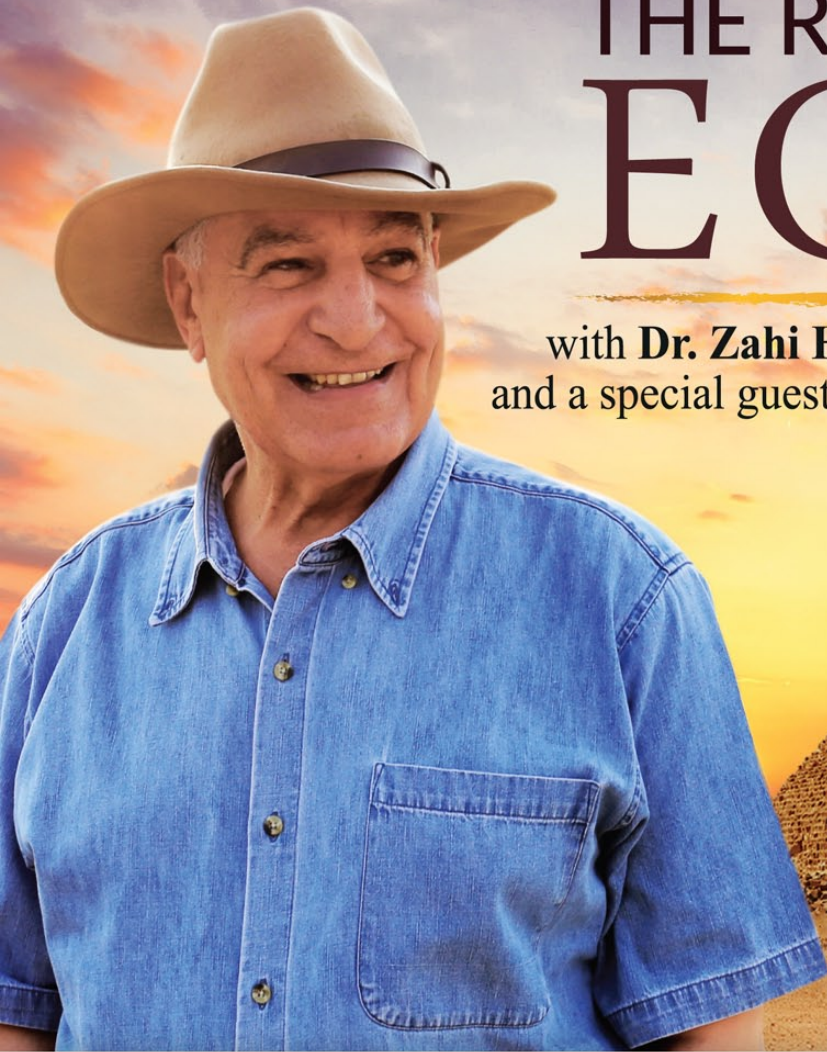
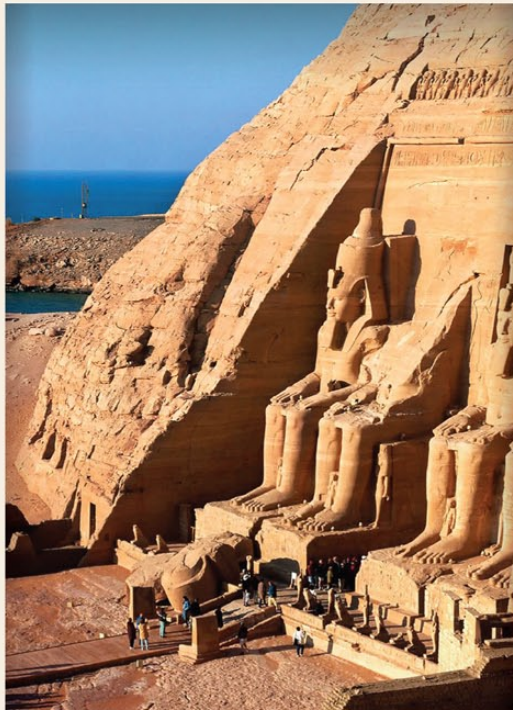

ABOUT THE ROYAL TOUR



Our 14-day itinerary has been carefully designed by *Archaeological Paths'* team in cooperation with Egyptologists and Dr. Zahi Hawass himself to provide you with a comprehensive tour through Egypt's fascinating history. We begin with the oldest monuments of the ancient Memphis necropolis and the Great Pyramids of the Old Kingdom and we continue the tour chronologically on the Nile cruise to discover the monuments of the Middle and New Kingdoms.

Starting from the ancient Thebes, today known as Luxor, we will see Karnak and Luxor temples, the great mortuary temple of Hatchepsut and the tombs of the Pharaohs in the Valley of the Kings; sailing down the Nile we will visit breathtaking Edfu and Kom Ombo temples, and reach Aswan to discover the Philae temple located beautifully on an island; finally we will see the huge temple of Abu Simbel – guarded by enormous statues of Ramses the Great at the entrance. The tour includes a visit to the modern Cairo and the sightseeing in the Great Egyptian Museum.

Mrs. Sadat was first lady of Egypt from 1970 until 1981. She has devoted her life to public service and supports many initiatives to improve the life of Egyptian citizens worldwide. She has promoted literacy and founded Egypt's Wafa Wal Amal (Faith and Hope) Society for handicapped war veterans and civilians, the first and largest rehabilitation center of its kind in the Middle East.

Today, Jehan Sadat's mission is to maintain her husband's legacy, keeping alive his memory so that future generations will know that Egypt's President Anwar Sadat was a "man of peace." At the same time, she continues to deliver her own views concerning the importance of the family and civil rights. She became an outspoken advocate for peace in the Middle East and worldwide. She is a recognized hero of anti-war initiatives globally and attacks issues of primary education for Muslim youth to empower generations now and in the future with economic opportunities.

Day 1 - Arrival

Arrival at Cairo International Airport. A representative of the *Archaeological Paths* company will welcome our guests at the Cairo Airport and transport them to the luxurious 5-star hotel in Giza, situated near the pyramids. After the check-in process at the hotel, our guests will have time to rest and enjoy their dinner in the hotel's restaurant. Overnight stay at the hotel.



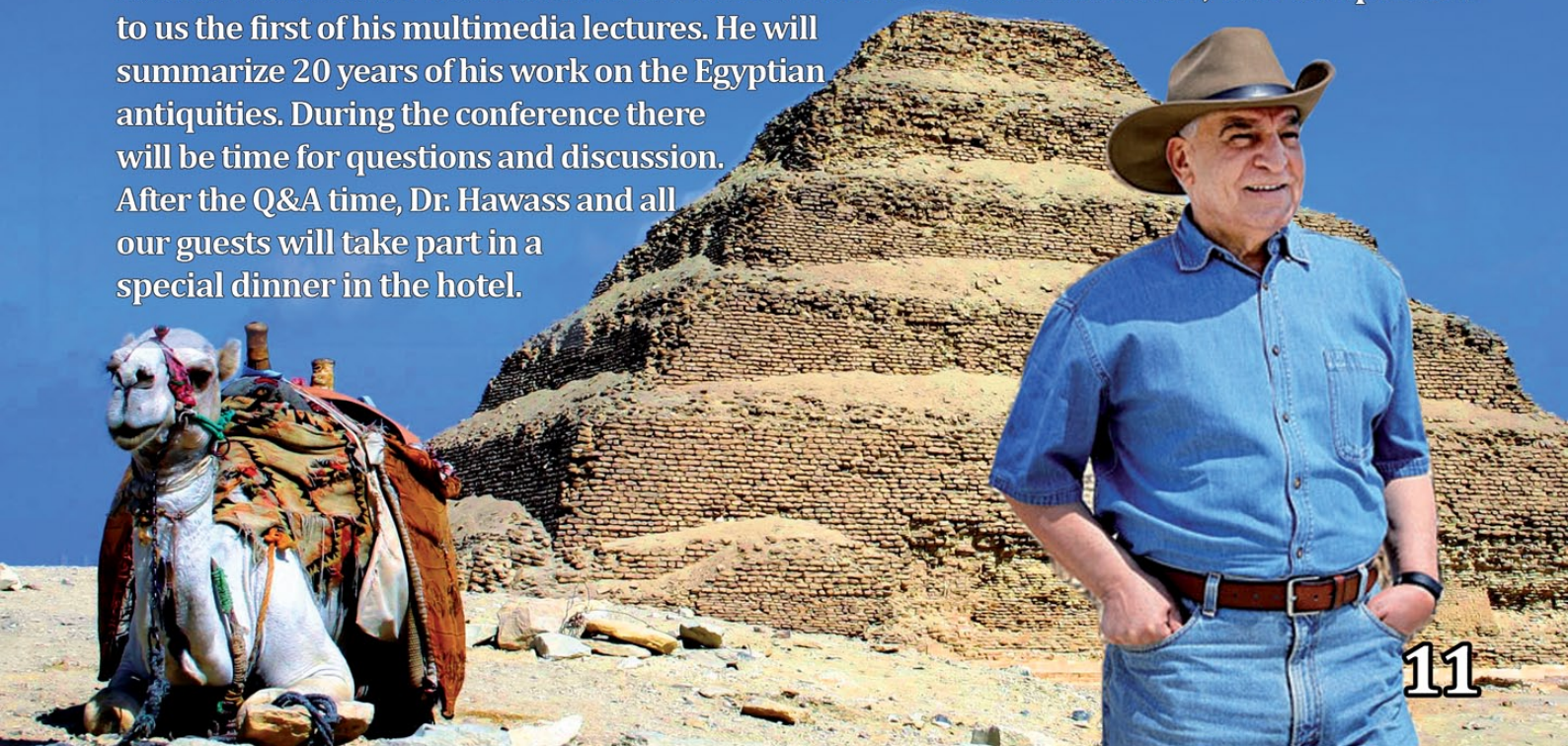
Day 2

Saqqara & multimedia lecture with Dr. Zahi Hawass

During our first day of sightseeing, we are going to Saqqara to see the Step Pyramid of King Djoser. It was constructed 4700 years ago by the legendary architect Imhotep and was the first pyramid ever built by the Egyptians. This over 200 feet high monument is the oldest pyramid in the world. We will visit the tombs decorated with impressive reliefs and paintings nearby the pyramid. We will end our sightseeing at Saqqara with a visit to the Pyramid of King Teti which boasts one of the oldest Pyramid Texts ever discovered.

In the afternoon we will return to our hotel to welcome Dr. Zahi Hawass, who will present to us the first of his multimedia lectures. He will summarize 20 years of his work on the Egyptian antiquities. During the conference there will be time for questions and discussion.

After the Q&A time, Dr. Hawass and all our guests will take part in a special dinner in the hotel.





Day 3

Dashour and Memphis

Pyramid Builders Tombs with Dr. Zahi Hawass

After breakfast, we are going to Dashour to see two pyramids built for Pharaoh Snefru, which are among the oldest, largest and best preserved in Egypt, built from 2613–2589 BC. The Bent Pyramid was probably the first planned from the outset to be a true pyramid, with smooth sides. It is the most unusual pyramid because of the fact that during its construction Egyptians changed its angle. Perhaps because of the awkward angles in the Bent Pyramid, Snefru ordered another pyramid to be built nearby – the Red Pyramid that we will have a chance to enter. It is an elegant precursor to the Great Pyramids at Giza.

After visiting the pyramids, we will see the ruins of Memphis, once the capital of Egypt. In Memphis, we will make a stop at the museum to admire a giant statue of Ramses II (about 35 feet in length) carved of monumental limestone.



After lunch there is another great attraction waiting for us that you can visit only as our company's guest. **Together, with Dr. Zahi Hawass, we will visit the Tombs of the Pyramid Builders at Giza** (2500 BC) It is one of the most outstanding discoveries made by Dr. Hawass over the course of his career. Pyramid Builders Tombs are closed to tourists because of ongoing archeological excavations, but our company received special permission to enter this area with Dr. Zahi Hawass.

Dr. Hawass: *I will take you to see my great discovery, the Tombs of the Pyramid Builders. It is called the most important discovery of the 20th century, because for the first time we could learn about the people who built the pyramids. Thanks to this visit you will know how the Ancient Egyptians built the pyramids.*

It was my dream to discover the tombs of the workmen who built the pyramids at Giza. I always say that this discovery is even more important than the tomb of King Tutankhamun, because there we found mainly gold, but the tombs of the Pyramid Builders reconstructed our history. It is an extremely important discovery, because it shone a new light on the Ancient Egyptian civilization.





Day 4 – Giza Plateau with Dr. Hawass & meeting with Madam Jehan Sadat

At 6 am, before the opening hours of the site for tourists, and thanks to special permission from the Ministry of Antiquities, we will enter the iconic Giza Plateau to see the three Great Pyramids and the Great Sphinx. These monuments were built by the pharaohs of the Old Kingdom (2500 BC).



Dr. Zahi Hawass will be waiting for us between the huge paws of the Great Sphinx. Tourists can normally see the Sphinx from the observation terrace in the distance, but our special permission will let us enter inside the Sphinx enclosure. **Dr. Hawass will tell us about his research on the Great Sphinx and the mystery of the Pyramids. We will also have a chance to learn about the newest project of scanning the Great Pyramids to search for hidden chambers under the direction of Dr. Hawass!**

Next, we will go inside the Great Pyramid of Khufu, the only one of the seven wonders of the ancient world that is still standing today. We will have private access inside the pyramid. What's more, the guards will open for us two additional chambers that are normally closed to the public – the Queen's chamber and the Subterranean chamber.

TOUR ITINERARY

Another highlight awaiting us today is the meeting and lecture with Mrs. Jehan Sadat, Egypt's former First Lady, in her home located by the Nile River. It will be a unique opportunity to see the residence of Egypt's former president - Anwar El Sadat.

Madam Sadat will tell us about her life as the first lady and about her lifelong goal and hope for world peace. We will learn more about the current situation in the world in the eyes of the wife of the president Anwar El Sadat, who effortlessly advocates for his ideals of peace.

After the lecture, there will be time for questions and discussion. This meeting will allow you to understand better Egypt's modern history and get to know personally Madam Jehan Sadat, the most distinguished "Woman of Egypt".





Day 5 - Flight to Luxor Karnak temple

On Day 5 we are flying from Cairo to Luxor. In Luxor, we will check-in on the luxury 5-star cruise ship, our floating hotel. This 8-day Nile Cruise features various stops and site visits including all the most impressive monuments from the time of the Pharaohs.



Our first stop will be the famous Karnak temple. It is the largest temple in the world. Located on the east bank of the Nile, Karnak complex was not a single temple, but a series of temples, halls, enclosures and obelisks with a sacred lake that was built, modified, added to, rebuilt, and so on, continuously for some two thousand years, from Middle Kingdom times (circa 2040-1780 BC) to Greco-Roman times (circa 332 BC to 400 AD).





Day 6 - Luxor

After breakfast we will start the sightseeing of the west bank of Luxor. Our sightseeing tour will start with a motor boat ride across the Nile to see the highlights of Luxor:

- The Valley of the Kings

The Valley of the Kings was the royal cemetery for 62 Pharaohs and is located on the west bank of the Nile in Luxor. In the Valley of the Kings, we will have access to some well-known tombs. The Valley is undeniably one of Egypt's most important treasures.



- Temple of Queen Hatchepsut, Deir el-Bahari

The Temple of Deir el-Bahari is one of the most characteristic temples in Egypt. It was built of limestone, not sandstone like most of the other funerary temples of the New Kingdom period. Hatchepsut was the first queen to rule over Egypt in ancient Egyptian history (approximately from 1473 to 1458 BC).

- The Colossi of Memnon

The Colossi of Memnon are two massive stone statues of Pharaoh Amenhotep III. For 3,400 years they have sat in the Theban necropolis, across the River Nile from the city of Luxor. The original function of the Colossi was to stand guard at the entrance to Amenhotep's memorial temple – a massive cult centre built during the pharaoh's lifetime.





Day 7 - Luxor temple with Dr. Hawass

We will have the extraordinary privilege to visit Luxor temple privately with Dr. Zahi Hawass. The temple will be beautifully lit - against the background of the dark night sky – just for our group! Dr. Hawass will tell us more about the archeological research and his discoveries in Luxor.

Luxor temple is one of the most beautiful Ancient Egyptian temples located on the east bank of the Nile River. The city known today as Luxor (ancient Thebes) was founded in 1400 BC. For centuries Thebes was the capital of Ancient Egypt.

After returning from the Luxor temple, you can enjoy a cup of Egyptian coffee and share your impressions with Dr. Hawass on our cruise ship. The ship will start sailing to Edfu after lunch. The rest of the afternoon is free for leisure, so our guests can enjoy the sundeck on the ship and the stunning views of the Nile landscape while sailing to Edfu.





Day 8 - Edfu and Kom Ombo temples

In the morning, our cruise ship will bring us to Edfu with its splendid Edfu temple. It is the best preserved ancient temple in Egypt dedicated to the falcon god Horus. It was built in the Ptolemaic period between 237 and 57 BC. After the return to the ship, we will start the cruise towards Kom Ombo.

In the late afternoon we will reach Kom Ombo, where we will visit the Ptolemaic Kom Ombo Temple. It was built during the period from 205 till 180 BC in the ruling period of King Ptolemy V. The Ptolemies constructed the Temple of Kom Ombo for the worship of two gods, Sobek – the crocodile god and Horus – the falcon god. After visiting the site we will return to the ship for the dinner and our ship will start sailing south towards Aswan.



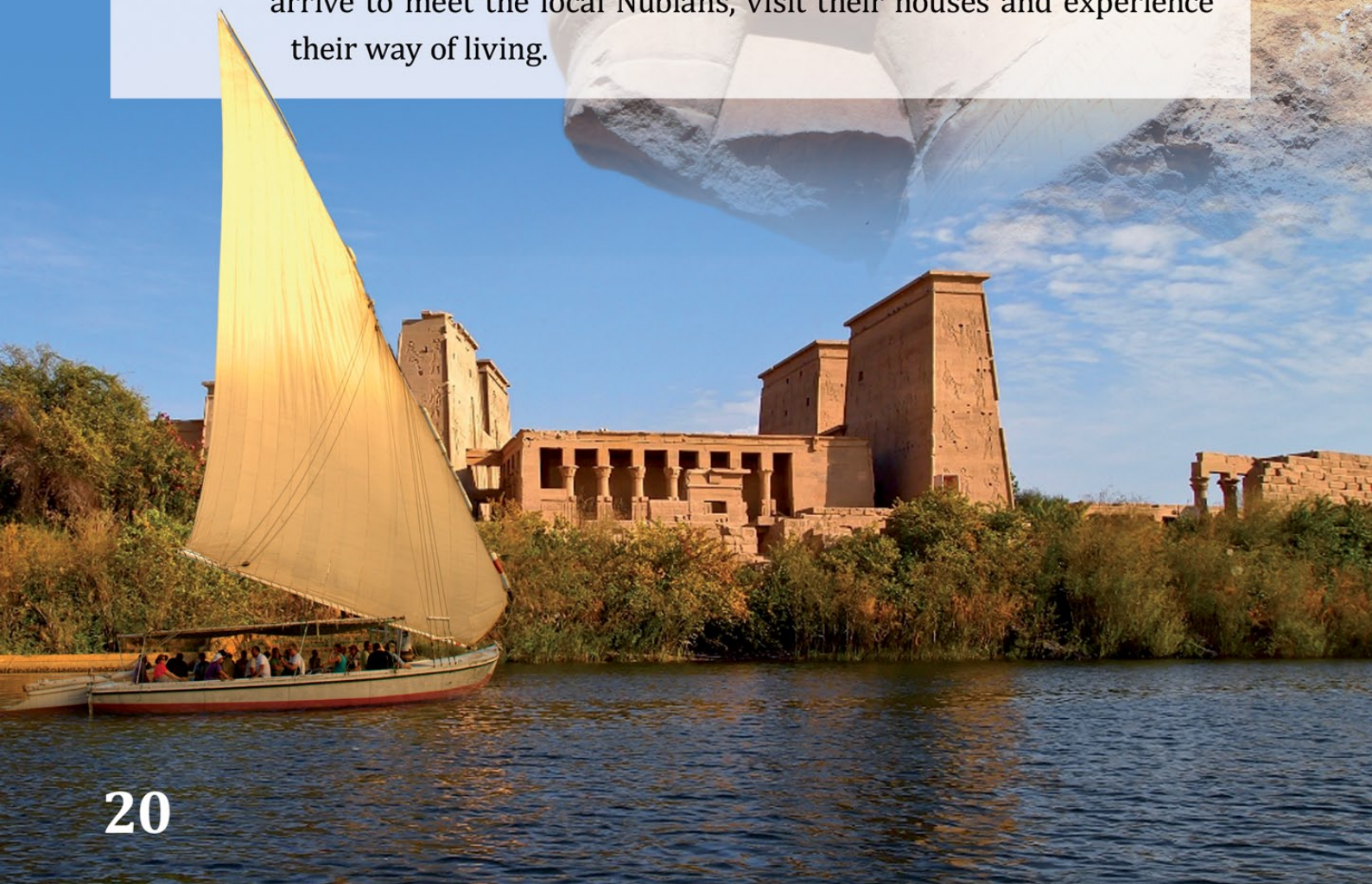


Day 9 - Aswan

After breakfast, we will start the sightseeing of Aswan. The day will begin with driving to the Unfinished Obelisk. It is the largest known ancient obelisk and it is located in the northern region of the stone quarries of ancient Egypt in Aswan. It is nearly one third larger than any ancient Egyptian obelisk ever erected. If it were finished, it would have measured around 140 feet and would have weighed nearly 1200 tons.

Next we will take a motor boat ride to the Temple of Philae, located beautifully on an island and dedicated to Isis, the goddess of health, marriage and wisdom. Philae was considered one of the burial places of the god Osiris, so the island was a sacred place for Ancient Egyptians. The temple consists of monuments of various eras, extending from the Pharaohs to the Caesars.

After our return to the ship and having lunch, we will have time to relax during the Nile cruise by a motor boat to the Nubian village. Small boats will take us through the narrow passages on the Nile. We will have time to admire the beauty of Egyptian nature and stunning views on the Nile, before we arrive to meet the local Nubians, visit their houses and experience their way of living.





Day 10 - Abu Simbel

The next day in Aswan will start with a journey to the majestic Abu Simbel temple. The temple in Abu Simbel is one of the most imposing, impressive and iconic symbols of Ancient Egypt, rivaling the Great Pyramid and the Great Sphinx. Abu Simbel temple was originally carved out of the mountainside during the reign of Pharaoh Ramesses II in the 13th century BC as a lasting monument to himself and his queen Nefertari.





Day 11 - Sailing back to Luxor

In the morning our cruise ship will leave Aswan and head back to Luxor. You will have a leisure day to spend time on the beautiful sundeck during the sailing. You will admire and enjoy the views on the Nile, greenery, desert in the distance, farmers and picturesque villages. Our guide will be available on the sundeck for you to answer all the additional questions you may have about the monuments you visited.



Day 12 - Flight to Cairo multimedia lecture with Dr. Zahi Hawass

We will take a flight back to Cairo. After lunch and some free time to rest we will take part in the second multimedia lecture with Dr. Zahi Hawass. Dr. Hawass will take us on a fascinating journey of research and excavations he conducted in the last 20 years of his work in Egypt. He will also discuss in more detail his plans for the new great discoveries. We will learn about new, mostly undiscovered sites in Egypt which are subjects of ongoing archaeological research.



Day 13 - Tour of Cairo

After our breakfast, we will begin our day sightseeing in Cairo, the capital of Egypt. We will visit The Grand Egyptian Museum, one of the most important museums in the world. It contains the world's largest collection of Pharaonic antiquities. We will see the famous Tutankhamun exhibit with the golden mask of the boy king. After lunch we will drive to the Saladin Citadel and Mosque of Muhammad Ali. The Saladin Citadel is an Islamic fortress dating to the twelfth century which was built to unite the city and protect it from Christian crusaders. The Mosque of Muhammad Ali was built on the summit of the citadel during the first half of the nineteenth century. In the evening, during our farewell dinner, we will celebrate the two weeks of our exciting adventure.



Day 14 - Departure from Cairo or *1-day Add-on to Alexandria

It is the last day of our tour and time to say goodbye to Egypt. After breakfast we will transfer you to the Cairo International Airport. You will leave Egypt with new experiences, memories and beautiful photographs. *Archaeological Paths* company will do everything to ensure that our guests will have the time of their lives during our exciting adventure.

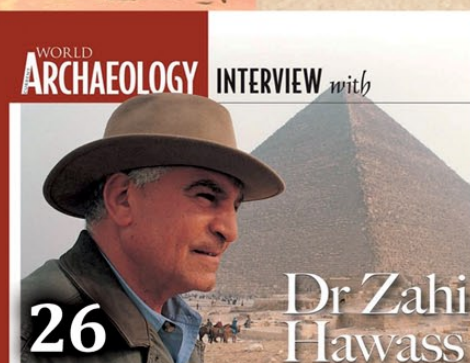

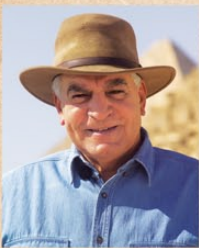

The visitors have to leave everything outside and the security makes sure that they are OK to come inside.

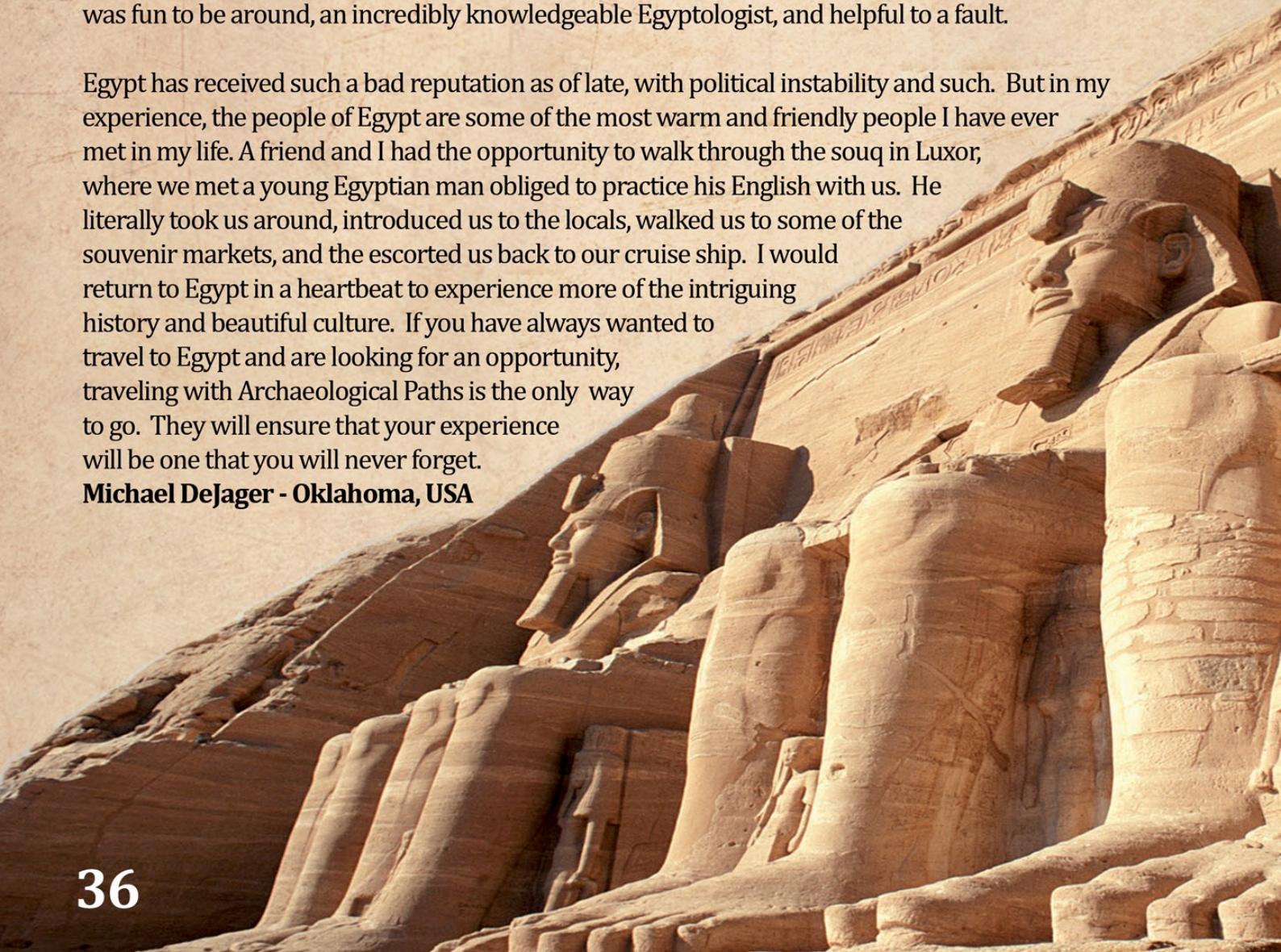
